How did it start?

Saver Plus began in 2003 as a Brotherhood of St Laurence and ANZ pilot program with 268 participants in three sites across Victoria and New South Wales.

Since then, the program has expanded to all Australian states and territories, reaching more than 32,000 people, making it the largest and longest-running program of its kind in the world.



From 25 November to 10 December, the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence is a time to galvanize action to end violence against women and girls around the world.

This year Wagga Family Support Service and the Women's Domestic Violence Court Advocacy Services are presenting a book launch and information session to raise awareness of the 16 Days of Activism and the important issue of violence against women.

The Skinny Girl is Steve M. Matthews' first adult novel. Although this is a work of fiction, it is based on interviews, research and published works. Raw, powerful and thought-provoking, *The Skinny Girl* explores the topic of domestic violence through a relationship between shy Daisy Croucher and popular pub local Jeff Singleton. The novel discusses the ways attitudes, values, and culture contribute to abuse, and the path to change.
