SPEAKING AND LISTENING IN KJ

In KJ we are learning the importance of listening carefully to our partner and speaking clearly so we can make the same object as our partner. Using clear instructions in sentences is very important in building each child's vocabulary. Engaging in daily conversations that encourage more than one word answers is extremely critical in building speaking and listening skills. In our barrier games students need to layout their pieces, describe each piece, using sentences so their partner knows which piece to pick up and build the same character or place their piece in the correct spot.
