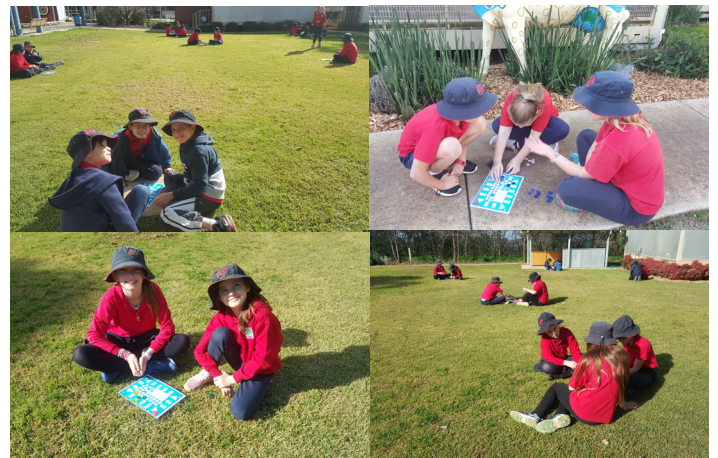

INTERSPORT WAGGA LAKE RUN RIDE - SCHOOLS CHALLENGE
