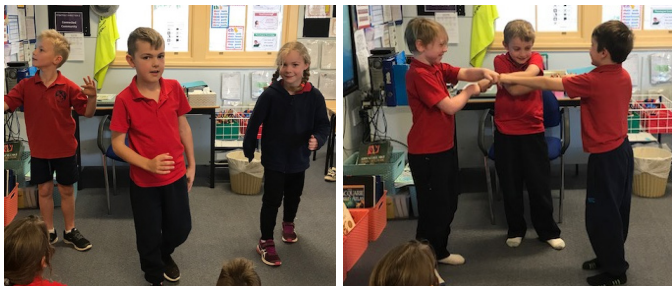

2M's Stop Motion Animation

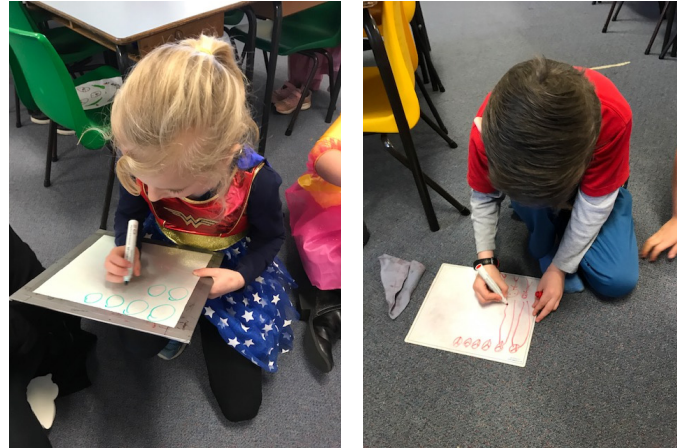

Purpose: Developing positive attitudes towards learning for all students.

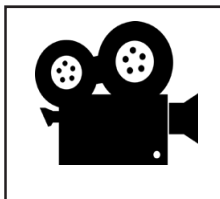
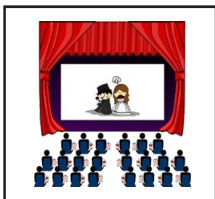
Nine participants are trialing a program that has been jointly designed and financed by Sport and Recreation together with Forest Hill Public School.

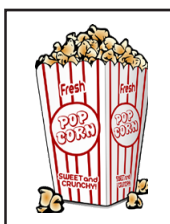

Leave us the plastic lids from your milk, water, juice and soft drink bottles and they'll be converted into prosthetic hands for kids.

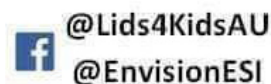
